David Morris (1959-2010)

David Morris was a disability campaigner, loved and widely admired. At the time of his death, he was on secondment from his role as Senior Policy Advisor on Disability to the Mayor of London, working with the London Organising Committee of the Olympic Games (LOCOG) as External Access and Inclusion Coordinator. Boris Johnson, Mayor of London, said he “campaigns tirelessly for disability rights.” Lord Coe, chair of LOCOG, called him “a life-enhancer.”
